



OSHA GHS Classification of Ink and Toner Printer Cartridges

Federal hazardous materials disclosure requirements do not apply to Innovera ink and toner printer cartridges.

29 CFR 1910.1200 requires the classification of the hazards of all chemicals produced or imported.

Under 29 CFR 1910.1200(b)(6)(v), the requirement does not apply to "articles". Articles are defined under 1910.1200(c) as:

"a manufactured item other than a fluid or particle: (i) which is formed to a specific shape or design during manufacture; (ii) which has end use function(s) dependent in whole or in part upon its shape or design during end use; and (iii) which under normal conditions of use does not release more than very small quantities, *e.g.*, minute or trace amounts of a hazardous chemical (as determined under paragraph (d) of this section), and does not pose a physical hazard or health risk to employees."

Innovera inks and toners fall under the definition of articles and do not potentially release chemicals during normal operating conditions therefore are articles exempt from the requirements, as per 29 CFR 1910.1200(b)(6)(v).
